3. Approval of the Agenda – Rilla approved, Brian seconded
4. Review and Approval of the January 27th minutes – Cynthia approved, Rilla seconded.
5. Actions from Previous Minutes
 - a) Lamp posts – Peter
Peter will speak with Omar -SLRD- about more lights are not working
SLRD has enough money in the budget to continue with lamp post maintenance
 - b) No Trespassing Sign –
FCCA had a meeting in the fall with Fine Peace and it was agreed they would put up NO TRESPASSING signs on their property
A resident responded to Peter and said the big sign at end of Furry Creek Drive will remain
SLRD has referred the issue to their Bylaw Department
SLRD has also been in contact with the MOTT
 - c) Garbage Cans at mailbox –
Peter will reach out to Miller Cap

- d) Broken Furry Creek highway sign and dead heather update
 Rilla met with Geoff Abbott -Road Area Manager – MOTT
 Landscaped areas – near highway off/on ramp
 -Although this is within MOTT right-of-way, this landscaping would have been originally installed by the developer, with ongoing maintenance being the responsibility of the developer. MOTT said if FCCA wants to maintain it to its former standard it will fall to the FCCA, SLRD, and current owners.
 Faux-Stone signs
 -Originally installed by the developers and not the responsibility of MOTT
 -MOTT suggested we reach out to SLRD and the developer to work out which organization will take the reigns for these items
- e) Pop up Party to introduce and make people aware of the FC Emergency Preparedness Plan
 -deferred until more info comes in
- f) Defibrillator training- FCCA will ask Brian Owen if he would organize a new training session for residents in Furry Creek. The last training was held in 2024

 -No trees have come down over the winter
 -FCCA hopes to receive monies from the SLRD to maintain the caretaker program
 -Jay, Brian and Peter will put together a grant proposal for SLRD by Thursday at noon

New Business

- a) FCCA Emergency Preparedness Plan – deferred
- b) FCCA Website – Peter and Marsha will work on a redesign
- c) FCCA Code of Conduct -Cynthia brought forward a sample Code of Conduct to start the process of developing a FCCA Code of Conduct. It was discussed that most nonprofit associations have a Code of Conduct. Board members will review the sample Code of Conduct and will come to the meeting with suggestions on additions, changes and deletions.
- d) Annual fee -FCCA board reviewed the constitution and validated that if you chose to be a FCCA member you must pay a 50.00 fee per household annually. Only paid members will receive communication updates from FCCA.
- e) Ocean Crest Property Taxes – Sen was absent – item will be deferred. However, Tony from SLRD reported that SLRD has nothing to do with residents' tax bills.
- f) New Membership Campaign and marketing of the upcoming AGM- Marsha will be doing a membership campaign door to door inviting residents to join the FCCA and inviting them to the AGM. Peter and Marsha are going to work on a flyer outlining the FCCA accomplishments and what the members get for their 50 dollars which will be handed out at the doors. Peter and Marsha will also be looking at reaching out to local corporations to become corporate members.
- g) AGM Preparations -Board discussed a possible date for the AGM, venue, presentations, guest speakers, door prizes, and registration and payments at the AGM
